



Efforts will be on quality of education at Rajiv Gandhi South Campus: Prof. D.P. Singh



The Vice-Chancellor of Banaras Hindu University Prof. DP Singh said that apart from the Vindhya region, the people of Jharkhand, Chattisgarh and Uttarpradesh have great expectations from the Rajiv Gandhi South Campus at Barkachha (Mirzapur), the projects targeting welfare of the rural population and development of the tribal belt should be promoted. Since joining the Banaras Hindu University as Vice-Chancellor recently he visited the South Campus on 30th May, 2008 along with senior teachers and officers. Addressing a meeting of teachers and employees at Barkachha, the Vice-Chancellor said that the curriculum, programmes and projects at this campus should be focused as per the needs and requirements of the tribal belt. He said that all the schemes launched earlier would continue and efforts would be made to get more projects sanctioned from the Human Resource Development and other

ministries.

He said that the courses which were started at South Campus should be popularized through media, bulletins and newsletters and instead of launching large numbers of courses, stress should be given to quality of education according to him, for this campus we have to chalk out a long-term action plan of 50 years. During his visit, the Vice-Chancellor saw bright prospects of bio-plant preservation, naturopathy and yoga courses at the campus and said that yoga classes should be made compulsory for all the students.

According to him, development projects should be of such nature that they send a positive impact to the people. He said that proper infrastructure at the campus for 1000 students in the coming academic session should be developed and instructed the concerned officers that the ongoing construction work of lecture halls, teachers apartments and academic complex should be completed soon. He said that the courses should be run on the guidelines of the central and state government so that the students should take their advantage.

aranasi: BHU "Lord Rama is inseparable part of Indian culture, and there should be no doubt or debate on his existence", said Karan Singh, noted scholar and Chancellor of Banaras Hindu University (BHU), responding to the queries of media persons regarding the Setu Samundram shipping canal project of the Central government. Dr. Singh was at the Rajiv Ghandhi South Campus of BHU at Barkachha in Mirzapur district to inaugurate the central library building.

Rejecting the view of the archaeological survey of India (ASI), he said that it was wrong to challenge the existence of Lord Rama. "The popularity of Lord Rama could be seen even in foreign countries where people stage Ram leela with much gusto." He said, adding that there should be no controversy on this issue as it was deeply rooted in Indian culture,

Replying to a query regarding the increasing menace of terrorism, he said that since it had become a global concern it was not proper to blame anyone for it, "There was a need to be alert to foil the design of subversive forces," he said.

He inaugurated the central library building. Addressing the inaugural function, Dr. Singh highlighted the importance of the library and good books. Showing his love for books he said that he preferred good books to anything else.


Asserting that some ideologies

are creating hurdles in the way of the progress of the country either in the name of religion or class, the Chancellor of Banaras Hindu University (BHU) Dr Karan Singh said that there was a need for concerted efforts for the development of India rather than a separate and individual effort.

While addressing the gathering at Rajiv Gandhi South Campus, Dr. Singh said that there were four pillars of Vidya (Learning), which were needed for development of any nation and







for the development of the personality of anyone. The first pillar was learning, being aware how to apply the attain knowledge and added that the second pillar was learning to do so that the knowledge could be used for any purpose. "There is no meaning of education which cannot create jobs," he added.


"The third pillar is learning to live together and it means a developed India is possible only with the joint efforts and not an individual and separate effort", he added that the collective view enhances the working capacity and some ideologies are creating hurdles in the progress of the country but there is a need of working together like a team for the development of India.

"The last and fourth pillar is learning to be which means to know one's inner strength as God resides in one and all, and the tyranny, evasion and exploitation in the name of religion and class is wrong," said Dr Singh. He further added that it also meant that one could develop and strengthen one's personality with it. Dr Singh also praised the Vice-Chancellor of the University Prof. Panjab Singh for bringing

development to this deserted area and hoped that the south campus of the university would also gain fame in the entire world in the field of learning like the main campus.

The V-C said that this area had converted into a naxalite belt and hence he had taken the development of the south campus of BHU as a challenge because it could become a livelihood for thousands of families.

During the last one and half year a lot of work has been done here and the facilities of drinking water, internet, hostel, hospital etc, have been provided.



"It is at this moment like a growing child and it needs to be developed more," he said and added that the university had sent a project of Rs. 300 crore to the Government of India for the purpose and sought the help of the varsity chancellor to get it approved.

He hoped that the South Campus would develop as a unique university.

In the beginning, the coordinator of RGSC, BHU Dr. Shiv Raj Singh welcomed the Chancellor. The varsity Registrar N Sundaram proposed the vote of thanks. Many varsity teachers, heads of various departments, deans of various faculties, employees and students were present on the occasion.







Addressing the gathering of students, officials and locals on the occasion, the V-C said that Water would no longer prove to be the stumbling block in the development of the region. He gave special thanks to Munnilal, a local farmer who had donated his land to lay pipelines through which waster was collected in an overhead tank. Promising that all necessary facilities would be extended to the region within two months, the V-C said that proposal for a special project Rs.300 crore for development of south campus was sent to the Planning Commission and he was hopeful to get a positive reply in this regard. Giving instructions to all senior teachers to get involved in teaching.

No Country Can Suppress India: Chidambaram

Government and BHU to work on climatic changes

Prime Minister Prof. R
Chidambaram stressed the need
for developing high revolution climate
modeling in the country to get more
effective forecasts. He was addressing
the press persons at the Rajiv Gandhi
South Campus of Banaras Hindu
University at Barkachha Farm in
Mirzapur district on the 11th
December.

Prof. Chidambaram said that several major forecasting programmes are being launched in the country and in this direction the government has set up a committee on climatic change, which is being headed by him. He said that in the coming years, the government in cooperation with the BHU would make some positive works in the field of climatic changes. He praised the progress of this campus of university in a short span of time.

Earlier Prof. Chidambaram inaugurated the newly constructed health centre building there. During his visit he also visited newly constructed library, hostels, lecture rooms, guest house, tissue culture lab. etc. He said that he was surprised to see such a remarkable progress here in such a short period. He also inspected the dispensary



counter, emergency dressing, minor OT and women's and men's wards at newly opened health centre.

Speaking on the occasion, Vice Chancellor Prof. Panjab Singh said that the university has sent a proposal to state government for setting up a 500 bed hospital at its South campus. Besides, he said that the university had also sent a proposal of 300 crore to the Planning Commission and informed

that a climatic change centre would be set up there soon.

Prof. Chidambaram also informed that a Rural Technology Action Group has been set up which aimed at working with non-governmental organizations in field of high technological development. In this direction, Uttarakhand and Chennai apart from IITs of Guwahati and Kharagpur have already set up RTAG Centres.





Prof. R. Chidambaram, the Principal Scientific Advisor of the Government of India was in BHU on 10th and 11th December 2007. He was speaking on the occasion of "D.S. Kothari Memorial Lecture" was speaking on the topic "Strategies for Innovation Leadership". He was confident that the country will very soon reach the status of developed countries. But for this you require to

take some commitments very seriously. We have to very cautiously with strong determination take up the areas we have decided to develop. He said we are at the juncture where no country can influence us but we must take the current opportunity to excel in various field of importance.

He further said that the country is as good as the best country of the world. We have to be very critical and serious about our nuclear programme and we should provide the stability to the 'Indian World Class Nuclear Programme' to harbour macro nuclear benefits. It is important to be exposed to the world standard knowledge in every aspect of science. He said very soon BHU will be connected through knowledge commission to the super connectivity service. This will be very useful for the university.
