Framework

Guidelines for Paper Submission:

- Only original and unpublished work is sought. The contributors should certify that manuscript has neither been published anywhere nor is being considered presently anywhere for publication.
- Submission should include a separate title page which clearly indicates the name(s) of the author(s), affiliation(s), complete
 mailing address (s), telephone/fax numbers and e-mail address(s), title of the paper and up to four key words that describe
 the paper. The last sheet of the paper should have a brief autobiography of the author(s) in not more than 100 words.
- For preparation of the manuscript, the author(s) are requested to follow APA Citation Style. An electronic version of the manuscript in MS-Word format should be submitted via e-mail and a hard copy of the same should be sent. (All text should be in single space with 1 inch margin on all the sides on (A4) size paper using a font size of 12 in Times Roman).
- Few selected papers would be considered for publication in the form of a book to be published under different themes of the summit on the occasion.
